he Heathdale community welcomed its first students on the 10th of February in 1982 and has been providing authentic Christian education to families in the western suburbs of Melbourne ever since. Our educational approach is rooted in the Word of God and focuses on nurturing the whole child — academically, spiritually, physically, and emotionally. This fundamental belief shapes our College's identity and helps each child thrive from a Christ-centred perspective.

We value the partnership between parents and the school, fostering a love of learning and curiosity throughout each student's educational journey. As students grow into young adults, we aim to develop their deep understanding and wisdom. Our goal is to instil Christian values such as integrity, honesty, respect, love, honour and truth, all of which inspire students to discover their God-given potential and serve both locally and globally. At Heathdale, a student's learning journey can begin in Kindergarten and continue through to Year 12. We offer a wide range of subjects and robust learning programs that encourage excellence in all areas of life. The early years focus on building a strong foundation in literacy, numeracy, science, and humanities. In early secondary school, students explore various subjects, learn up to three languages, participate in sports for personal growth and competition, study science, math, creative and visual arts, embrace leadership opportunities, and engage in community service. This diverse curriculum leads to one of the most extensive selections of subjects for VCE, VCE VM and VET in the western suburbs. Our aim is to empower students to achieve outstanding results and feel confident as they move forward in their life's journey. With this solid educational platform, we provide each student with a unique pathway beyond school.

By August 2022, we had grown to 2085 students (Kinder to Year 12) across our Melton and Werribee campuses. The College's Federal Government's Direct Measure of Income (DMI) model, calculated Heathdale's capacity to contribute (CTC) score as 10.







The Learning Journey: Celebrating Learning



ith 2022 heralding an opportunity to celebrating the College's 40th Anniversary, it was only fitting that the Heathdale community has been doing what we do best; making our 40th year of learning one to remember for our students, staff and families.

Our students were eager to continue the trend of enjoying their schooling on-campus together, and what a way to kick off than with some STEM fun? Year 7 and 8 students embraced the joy of maths at the entertaining Felstead Maths Show, Oobleck creation was a hit for our Year 6 classes, and our Year 9 and 10 classes took part in the Victoria University Cyber Security Program. Our Year 12 chemistry students accepted an invitation to conduct their High-Pressure Liquid Chromatography (HPLC) practical at the Monash Uni Pharmaceutical Sciences Lab. We also saw our students in action at the Australasian Problem-Solving Mathematical Olympiads (APSMO) this year, with Team A placing top 10% of Australia and New Zealand in their division. Top scoring student, Mei Zhang, received a near-perfect 24/25!

Our LOTE aficionados starred in the Education Perfect Language Championships, with Edric Rodrigo (W6B) tallying the highest score of 8243 points. French Week saw students enjoying fun activities uniquely related to France's history, cuisine and culture – with obligatory crêpes, of course – Chinese language students took a trip to Melbourne's Chinatown to immerse themselves in the local culture and expression, and our Latin students played their part in learning and keeping the ancient yet enduring language alive through illustrative storytelling. Primary students learned about the alphabet through activities like the Prep Teddy Bear's picnic for the letter 'Tt,' complete with bear hunts and songs, and paraded in their unique hats as they learned about the letter 'Hh.' To reinforce the 'ck' sound, Year 1s celebrated Silly Sock Day, wearing colourful, crazy and mismatched socks for a playful learning experience. Primary students also celebrated the wonder of reading at Book Week with creative dress-ups and got to participate in an interactive storytelling show hosted by Perform Education.

Students displayed exceptional talent in various creative fields, showcasing their skills in design, media, visual art, woodwork, music, drama and more. Year 7 Woodworking brought masterful timber wood jet plane creations to life, a product of hard work and careful attention to detail. Year 11 Studio Arts provided opportunities for students to explore materials, techniques, and themes inspired by artists like KAWS and Jeff Wall, addressing topics like war and conflict. Additionally, Textiles students from Years 9-10 practiced their unique sewing skills, experimenting with everything from embroidery stitches to personalised hoodies.

Of course, all of this was made possible through the support our staff give to their students, helping each student develop a growth mindset through setbacks and difficulties that demonstrates a commitment to continuous improvement, and the will to keep on running all throughout the learning journey.

In the overall standings, Taylor's early lead shifted as other events unfolded. Ultimately, Stanway claimed first place, with Judson, Taylor, and Carey following suit.

Werribee's first ever Primary Athletics Carnival marked a historic milestone, bringing together students for a day filled with exciting 100m and 200m sprints and field events. REHOBOTH FUNDRAISERS

Rehoboth Children's Home is a Christian orphanage in the small town of Santa Maria, that provides a home to orphaned and unwanted kids in poverty, where they can be loved and cared for. Rehoboth takes care of them, providing them with essential belongings. This allow the kids to be a part of a family and to have an enjoyable life. Adding to that, Rehoboth lets children go on a holiday to learn about technology and have a memorable life experience.

Rehoboth's vision is to provide a God-loving environment where children and young people are enabled to reach their full potential and are encouraged to develop morally, emotionally, physically and spiritually, to become responsible and productive members of their family and society. In other cases, support is given through the Rehoboth Educational Assistance Programme (REAP), which provides the children with financial assistance while they live either in their local community or, for the older college students, accommodation linked to their college, so that they learn to live independently. The needs of each person are assessed and monitored by Rehoboth staff to ensure appropriate support, living standards and quality of life is being provided.

We support Rehoboth because it is a blessing to help other kids in need wherever we can. It gives these kids an opportunity to experience a normal life, have nutritional food and leisure. Rehoboth is special since not only does it help children, but it also teaches them about God and the Christian way to live life. BIGGEST MORNING TEA



Financial Activities


