The Trial



"What shall I do, then, with Jesus who is called the Messiah?" Pilate asked. They all answered, "Crucify Him!" "Why? What crime has He committed?" asked Pilate. But they shouted all the louder, "Crucify Him!"

Matthew 27:22-23

Jesus faced a trial where people accused Him of things He had not done. The governor, Pilate, asked the crowd what to do with Jesus. They demanded for Jesus to be crucified, which means to be put on a cross and killed, even though Jesus was innocent. Pilate, wanting to make the crowd happy, agreed to Jesus being crucified.
