Purposefully Designed Spaces that Inspire Learning





THE SCIENCE CENTRE houses three purposebuilt labs devoted to both theoretical and practical learning in biology, chemistry and physics, with a complementary maker space. **THE VCE LEARNING HUB** features seven, flexible classroom learning zones and a breakout area for VCE students.





THE VCE STUDY CENTRE provides a welcoming space for VCE students to relax and bond as a cohort, as well as encouraging them to engage in independent study. Staff offices are also located nearby for accessibility and pastoral care.

SECONDARY HOMEROOMS are multi-zoned and purposefully designed to support our teachers in delivering flexible learning that at times may be best explored as an entire class, independently or in small groups.







VISUAL ARTS & MEDIA SPACES encourage students to create using a great variety of art and design mediums, that includes paint, charcoal, pottery, lino printing, and computer graphics. The central gallery for displaying student artwork was the first of its kind in Melton.

THE FOOD TECH KITCHEN invokes all the senses as students learn to prepare their own food. Students learn hands-on in an industrial-style kitchen to follow simple recipes and methods, before progressing to more elaborate techniques and flavours.






MUSIC SPACES promote students exploration of music theory, solo and ensemble performance, composition and recording. Students can also engage with private music tuition in piano, guitar, flute, clarinet, trombone, trumpet, tuba or drums.

THE GYMNASIUM offers versatile spaces for sports and fitness, encouraging students to push themselves physically and mentally. It includes PE classrooms, a fully equipped gym (boxing, weights, cardio), and a multi-sport area used for interschool competitions.

In Years 7 and 8, we build on foundations already established in Primary school as we widen the range of subjects available to students.

Students continue with known electives such as Art, Music, Health, Sport, Design Technology, Digital Technology and French as a second language; but enjoy access to Secondary-only electives such as Food Technology, Media and Visual Communications & Design.

Year 9 students are afforded greater choice over their selections – they can access electives such as 2D &

3D Art, Co-Creators and Fitness & Training. They can also choose if they want to continue learning a second language or opt for a cultural studies subject instead. In Year 10, our students continue preparation for the ever-changing landscape of a 21st century workplace, through Morrisby testing, developing a Career Action plan, receiving careers counselling in the lead-up to VCE, and engaging in our Careers Week program. This enables them to consider subject offerings that suit their interests. whether that be an academic or applied learning pathway.



Our extensive co-curricular offerings also serve to enrich our student experience at the College.

We provide opportunities for students to engage in a wide range of sporting competitions through School Sport Victoria and the Christian Schools Events Network, which include volleyball, tennis, softball, cricket, AFL, soccer, badminton, netball and basketball.

Students who are inclined towards the Creative Arts can also participate in private instrumental

music and lunch-time bands, with the option to perform at the Annual Music Recital or the Annual Talent Show.

Students can also channel their competitive spirit towards our inter-House competitions, whilst developing peer relationships across year levels. Inter-house events include our Swimming Carnival, Athletics Carnival, Cross Country and the Heathdale Cup (cross-campus competition).
